**TEEX** - Texas State University has the Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training (ALERRT) training program which focuses on active shooter preparedness and response. One of the courses they offer is the Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE). They have a train the trainer program to certify your staff or court security personnel on providing this civilian based response to active shooter events. The training is provided free of charge and can be conducted online.

- Consider doing a tabletop exercise with courthouse management using the incident which occurred at the Forsyth County Courthouse (link in YouTube video below). How would your court handle the aftermath of that active shooter attack if this was your courthouse? Who would handle public relations? What does that person say? Assuming your courthouse is closed for the remainder of the day, how do complete time sensitive court matters? How do you address the rising concerns by staff who don't feel safe at the courthouse? How do you handle employees who are so traumatized by the assault, they can't show up to work and want to file for worker's comp? How do you address juror safety concerns? These are just a few of the high-level decisions and discussions that need to occur following this type of critical incident.
